There is plenty of great fishing in Southern Maryland waters as the rockfish, spot, croaker, and flounder are pleasing anglers with regularity.

The spot, perch and croaker are in the mouth of the Patuxent for bottom fishermen. The mouth of Cuckold's creek at Hawk's Nest has been hot for those using bloodworms, peelers, and squid. The bay is loaded with oversize croaker for night fishermen at 72A.

Live-liners using spot are catching rockfish under the Solomon's Bridge around the pilings. Other live-lining locations are the Targets, Second Beach, the Gas Docks, and the out-fall at the Nuclear Power Plant.

Trollers and lure casters are finding breaking fish above the Gas Docks.

Bluefish are now invading the area with small breakers in the creeks and in the bay. Some bigger blues are in the southern regions around the Target Ship.

Surf fishermen are getting blues, rock, and croaker off of the pier at Point Lookout State Park.

Flounder fishermen are doing very well in the mouth of the Patuxent at the Three Legged. The edge of the ship's channel from buoys 74 to 76 has very good flounder fishing.

Saint Mary's Lake has fine largemouth bass everyday. There are plenty of bluegill and bream.
