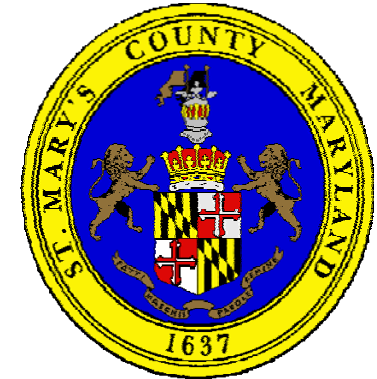

Be the first to know

A fast communication tool for emergency notification. When there is an emergency it is determined which neighborhoods or areas are affected a recorded message is created that describes the emergency and provides directions to the public. After the message is confirmed, a high-speed dialer delivers a phone message at a rate of 50,000 calls an hour to a live person or an answering machine.

The Emergency Notification System will already reach the majority of residents who have a landline phone. You can register your telephones and cell phones online to be notified by your local emergency response team in the event of emergency situations or critical community alerts. Residents and all businesses to personally register their phone and cell numbers if:

- You have moved or changed your phone number in the last 6 months
- You have an unlisted phone number
- You use your cell phone as your primary phone number
- You use TDD/TTY equipment
- Your local phone is a business
